

WOMEN'S OSHWAL CRICKET TOURNAMENT


Nairobi Titans defeated Super Chargers in the women's tournament championship game after needing to score 99 runs in just 6 overs.

VOC library - THANK YOU!

I seem to have discovered the joys of reading much later in life, and am so grateful to the VOC library for enabling this. My previous reading habits were to read a few books on my kindle, very selectively reading the first couple of chapters which are provided for free, before deciding to make the purchase. I would spend quite some time 'in the decision' of what to read. Since joining the library, I simply go to the library every month or so, and browse through only the 'new picks or highlighted books' in the small shelves near the check out desk and find a book of interest – which I personally would have never ventured near when I selected my own books. 9 times out of 10, I've loved the book I've borrowed and find I'm reading a much wider range than I had before.

Some of the memorable books I've read recently include:

The immortal life of Henrietta Lacks by Rebecca Skloot – tracing the evolution of cell biology's understanding and contribution to modern medicine, while exploring slavery and racism in the USA through a family's personal journey.

The boy who runs by John Bryant – which portrays the life of Julius Achon, an Olympic runner from Uganda who was abducted to serve in the Lords Resistance Army as a child, and integrates the politics of neighbouring countries and sports and the corporate world, and how so much can be salvaged through genuine family and friends support.

Amal Unbound by Aisha Saeed – a fictional story that is based on the life of Malala, and the challenge of access to education and feudal land rights.

The Watsons go to Birmingham 1963 by Christopher Paul Curtis – a look at the racial divide in USA around 1963 with a humorous lens of a loving black family that lives in the north and travels to the south

The content of many of these books may seem daunting, but the authors have all done an incredible job of making them very readable to the lay person who may not have much or any previously knowledge in the field.

Equally impressive is the VOC library app, where you can easily browse the whole library and extend your borrowed books etc.

Why do we do Namaste?



Indians greet each other with Namaste. The two palms are placed together in front of the chest and the head bows whilst saying the word Namaste. This greeting is for all - people younger than us, of our own age, those older than us, friends and even strangers.

There are five forms of formal traditional greeting enjoined in the Shaastras of which Namaskaaram is one. This is understood as prostration but it actually refers to paying homage as we do today when we greet each other with a Namaste.

Why do we do Namaste?

Namaste could be just a casual or formal greet-ing, a cultural convention or an act of worship. However there is much more to it than meets the eye.

In Sanskrit

Namah + te = Namaste.

It means - I bow to you - my greetings, salutations or prostration to you.

Namaha can also be literally interpreted as "na ma" (not mine). It has a spiritual significance of negating or reducing one's ego in the presence of another.

The real meeting between people is the meeting of their minds. When we greet another, we do so with Namaste, which means, "may our minds meet," indicated by the folded palms placed before the chest.

The bowing down of the head is a gracious form of extending friendship in love and humility.

The spiritual meaning is even deeper. The life force, the divinity, the Self or the Lord in me is the same in all. Recognising this oneness with the meeting of the palms, we salute with head bowed the Divinity in the person we meet. That is why some-times, we close our eyes as we do Namaste to a revered person or the Lord - as if to look within. The gesture is often accompanied by words like "Ram Ram', "Jai Shri Krishna", "Namo Narayana", "Jai Siya Ram", "Om Shanti" etc - indicating the recognition of this divinity.

When we know this significance, our greeting does not remain just a superficial gesture or word but paves the way for a deeper communion with another in an atmosphere of love and respect.


