Book of the Month Homegoing by Yaa Gyasi

Our first book of the month EVER comes from our own continent, and tackles the repercussions and impact of slave trade.

Drawing attention to the role played by Africans in the enslavement of their own people, this novel follows the initially divergent paths of two sisters, Effia and Esi, who do not know of each other, and who find themselves on different sides of the slave trade.

This initial gap in circumstances only seems to widen over generations and this is something that Yaa Gyasi explores beautifully, in a surprisingly short novel.

Despite covering several generations, Gyasi brings to razorsharp focus that 'defining moment' in each character's life, somehow bringing to the fore their essence, struggle and strength all at once.

This was the best aspect of the book for me. Eventually the progeny of the two half-siblings come full circle, in a way that I found unsatisfactory, but that was honestly my only complaint here.



Recently there have been many changes on the marriage registration process

Here's a little insight of the process:

To register existing marriages, i.e the marriages that have the Visa Oshwal Community Nairobi certificate:

- The original certificate and one photocopy to be brought to the Visa Oshwal Community office and letter will be issued based on the documents provided.
- This letter with the certificates to be taken to Hindu Council of Kenya where a forwarding letter will be issued within a weeks' time at a fee.
- The two letters (VOC letter and HCK letter) will then be submitted with a fee by the couple to Sheria House with copies of the bride and groom's ID/Passport and passport photographs upon which the registrar's office will set a date for the marriage registration.

To register new marriages:

The registration of marriages to be done in a time frame of 90 days. For example, if the marriage is on 3rd December the 21 days' notice has to be given at Sheria House a maximum of 90 days prior to the date i.e. anytime from 4th September. The couple will go together to Sheria House with the following documents:

- Copies of ID/Passport
- Color passport photos
- Signed affidavit. The Priest's license copy
- Birth Certificates and copies
- Serial number of the book assigned to the Centre where the marriage is to take place
- If widowed or divorced, then the death certificate or divorce decree

Ksh600/- initial registration fee

After 21 days another fee of 800/- to be paid to receive the Registrars Certificate to enable the couple to get married, this fee is applicable if the Centre is registered.


If the Centre is not registered, then a fee of Ksh7200/- needs to be paid for a Special License (Destination Wedding).

If both are Kenyans and not residing in Kenya and are unable to give the 21 days' notice, the couple need to provide proof as to why that was not possible and again fee of 7200/- will be charged as it becomes a Special License.

Once you get the registrars certificate or special license you will need to fill the VOC marriage details form and attach the requested documents with 2 copies of the registrars certificate/special license only applicable if the venue is Shree Visa Oshwal Community

You will need to submit these documents at least 3-5 days before your wedding date to the VOC

Samvaleari


