👜 Old Sarees, New Swag



OSHWAL SPOTLIGHT



We are proud to celebrate Dr. Rivani Rohin Shah, who recently completed her doctoral research at University College London (UCL), focusing on the development of personalised immunotherapies for paediatric brain tumours. Her PhD centred on the design and engineering of Chimeric Antigen Receptor (CAR) T-cell therapies — a cutting-edge approach that reprograms a patient's own T-cells to specifically target and destroy cancerous cells in the brain. Over four years of intensive research, Dr. Shah contributed to advancing the understanding of how CAR T-cells can be harnessed to treat some of the most challenging childhood cancers.

Dr. Shah's academic journey has been rooted at UCL, where she previously earned her undergraduate degree in Biomedical Sciences followed by a Master's in Infection and Immunity. Her work reflects a strong commitment to translational research and the future of personalised medicine. Her achievements mark a significant step forward in the field of paediatric oncology and immunotherapy.
